"Excellent communication"	"Persuaded cross-agency partners to co-fund joint initiative"
"Responsible for..."	"Oversaw \$20M grant portfolio impacting 500,000 residents"
"Duties included"	"Launched remote work policy adopted agency-wide"
"Seasoned"	"20+ years leading risk assessments across multi-billion dollar programs"
"Accomplished"	"Named 'Top Performance Manager' for 3 consecutive years"
"Worked with / served as"	"Collaborated with state officials to streamline compliance processes"

TELL A BUSINESS STORY USING THE C.A.R. METHOD

Instead of saying you're great—prove it.

Use the C.A.R. formula to turn dense federal experience into crisp business results:

C: What was the Challenge?

A: What Action did you take?

R: What Result did you deliver?

Example:

“Faced with rising cybersecurity incidents, led a multi-agency task force that implemented new protocols, cutting breaches by 60% within a year.”

POWER VERBS THAT SPEAK TO PRIVATE INDUSTRY

Federal resumes often emphasize oversight and compliance. But the private sector responds to verbs that highlight initiative, impact, and transformation.

Try verbs like:

Streamlined, Optimized, Revamped, Accelerated, Engineered, Transformed
Negotiated, Secured, Expanded, Brokered, Partnered
Innovated, Piloted, Launched, Modernized, Implemented
Reduced, Saved, Cut, Maximized, Elevated
Championed, Directed, Mobilized, Facilitated

Starting bullet points with these words forces you to immediately describe action + impact—exactly what hiring managers crave.

KEEP KEYWORDS FOR THE ATS

Even the best resume gets ignored if it's missing critical keywords. Pull language directly from the private sector job postings you're targeting—especially around hard skills, technologies, certifications, and industry methodologies—so your resume surfaces in applicant tracking systems (ATS) scans.

HIGHLIGHT YOUR STRENGTHS—WITHOUT SOUNDING GOVERNMENT-FORMAL

In federal environments, your reputation often speaks for itself. In the private sector, you have to tell that story—quantitatively.

Pick 2–3 strengths and back them up with data.

Examples:

Strategic | Analytical | Trusted Leader | Cost-Conscious | Adaptable | Innovation-Driven | Client-Focused | Decisive | Collaborative

QUESTIONS TO HELP YOU TRANSLATE YOUR VALUE

Use these prompts to pull business-ready stories out of your federal work:


- When did you reduce costs or save resources?
- What initiative helped cut timeframes or increase throughput?
- Did you solve a problem no one else could touch?
- What did your last evaluation or award highlight?
- How did you partner across agencies or with external stakeholders?
- What policy, process, or tool did you introduce that's still in use today?

Key Tips



Start with strong verbs like Streamlined, Launched, Negotiated, Secured, Partnered, Implemented, Directed, Elevated, Optimized.

Quantify everything. Use dollars, percentages, headcounts, or time saved.

Focus on outcomes. Private employers want to know what changed because of you.
